Gallery sales and visitations are very light. The restrictions of the pandemic and aftermath of a three month closing have reduced our available bank balance by \$7500 since January 1.

Our new treasurer, Denise Marker estimates that the gallery will be out of funds by the first of 2021 unless things change.

The Board discussed ways to increase our bottom line and to get more public support.

Suggested was...

- Ask our members if they might provide one month rent.
- 2. Start a Go Fund Me page
- 3. Ask our members if someone will serve as librarian in charge of Amazon book sales
- 4. Have a virtual First Friday and perhaps a silent auction. There are restrictions to have another Tailgate Art Sale.
- 5. Members can ask a business if they will be a



corporate sponsor of the gallery. You may have been supporting them for years. Corporate sponsors pay \$125 annually to support the visual arts in our community. Hand them a gallery brochure.

Robert Wilson's Passing a Shock to The Art Community



Robert Wilson was a friend to everyone. His painting style was unique and most unusual for Wenatchee as his subjects were not an image from nature nor representational art. As Susan Lagsdin wrote in the November 2014 Good Life Magazine, "he had a special way of seeing the world...when he attended classes at the University of Washington he was attracted to the abstract expressionism of painters Mark Tobey and Morris Graves. That typical way of seeing the world never left him."

Robert was a promoter of Wenatchee's art community. He was a board member of Two Rivers, Graves Gallery and active in the Pybus Market's art board and their events. He had many shows on the East coast, in the Seattle area, and Wenatchee galleries. Pybus Foundation established a scholarship in Wilson's memory. He will be sorely missed.


Our present show featuring Victor and Kellie von Beck continues through the 29th of August.
