Due to our increasing membership the gallery Board voted to limit the amount of wall space that can be entered by size and number of art on the walls.

Starting at our ENTRY period AUGUST 28 & 29 a member who presents a **24x36 or larger** artwork may only enter that one piece to be hung. No more than 3 pieces of work by any artist may be hung. We are trying to avoid hanging 3 pieces vertically unless appropriate.

**West Wing Painting & lighting**

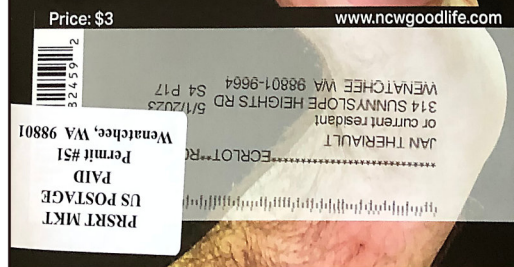

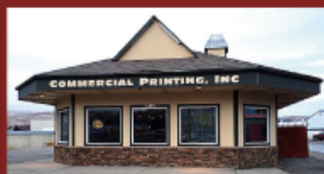
