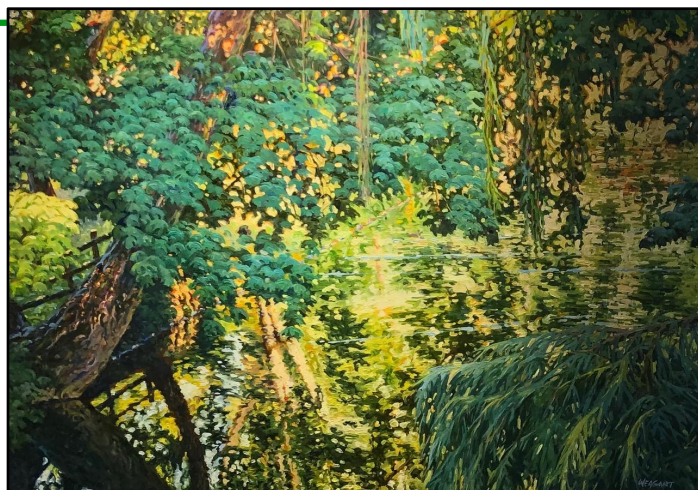

- Our gallery received grants for \$1000 from the Pitts-McConnell Foundation and \$2000 from Woods Family Music & Arts Grant. Our board directed Terri Timpe to apply for a grant from the Community Foundation. We were informed that that the grant had funding requests 3 times over their budget and told us to reapply again in the spring.

Terri just turned in an application grant for operating funds from The Icicle Fund. We hope all the hard work in applying will find it's rewards. Terri is a talented writer and we are pleased to have her as our Grant Administrator.

- The Wenatchee Chamber of Commerce sought nominations for Non Profit of the year. Based upon what we do for the community we think we have a good chance for that award, but there are several very good non profits to compete with.

- Now that we are back with First Fridays we have musicians who request to play for us. Playing in January we hope to get Patric Thompson. February's

musician will be Glenn Isaacson and Amy Albright on hammered dulcimer.

- We also thank local wineries for their donations. Wine, music and art pair well. Jen Evenhus gave us four more bottles of Goose Ridge Wines. She designed the labels and offered to help. Dan and Nancy Crandall volunteered to help contact wineries. They made a visit to Bianchi Winery above East Wenatchee and they will be dropping in with wine. Northwest Public Broadcasting donated a case of Gilbert Cellars wine. White Heron Cellars Cameron Fries encouraged local wineries to donate their wines to Two Rivers to help out the arts. He will drop a case by. We still need 4 other wineries to end the 2022 year.

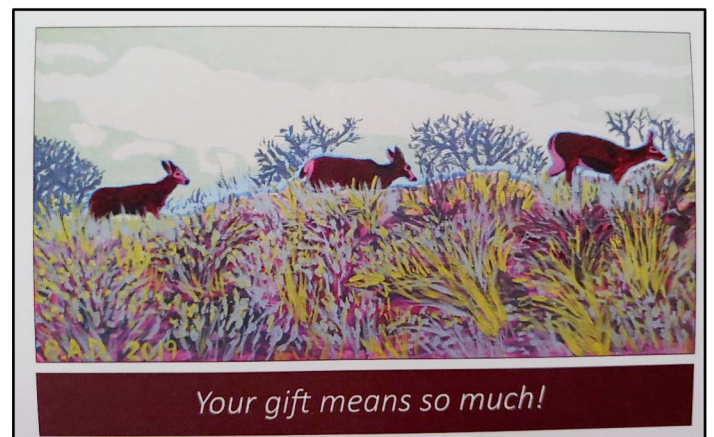
In the News
