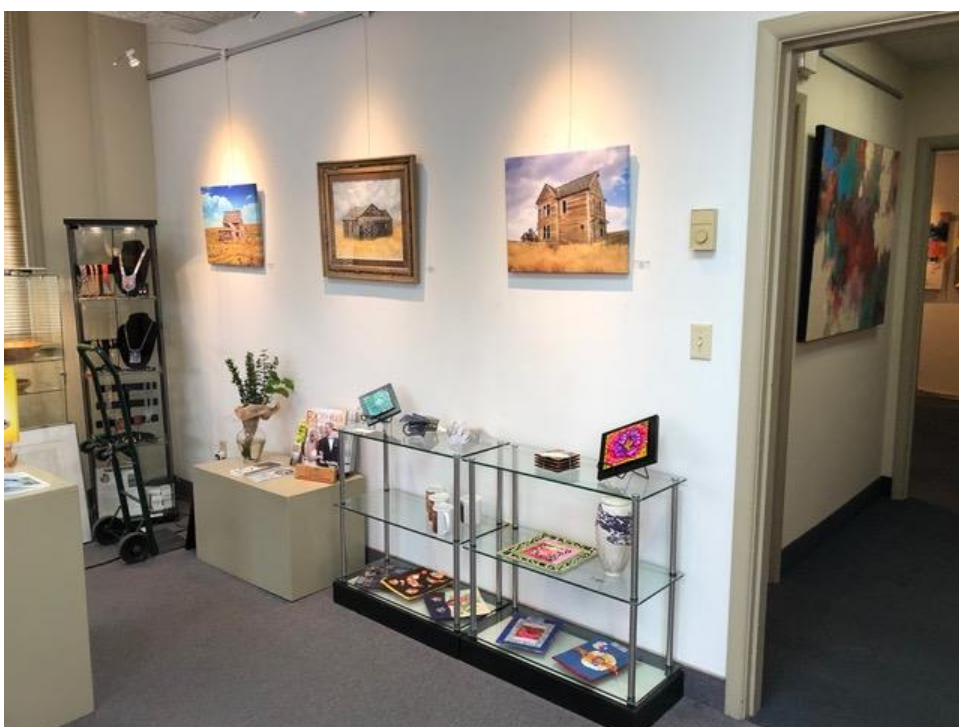
Since retirement they have both been pursuing their creative talents and interests Rick in photography and Evelyn in watercolors.
