

Our favorite pop duo played by Pat Thompson and Glenn Isaacson are often part of our opening night. They will be back to play for us in August.





Mathew Faust makes a purchase of two prints by Nicki Isaacson. Says he worked with her at Confluence Health.




Melody Scherting stands next to an acrylic painting by Barbara Bainard who encouraged Melody to join the gallery this evening.
