Attending the event was Claire Oatey and her mother Debbie. Claire is Director of Community Grants, NCW Community Foundation.



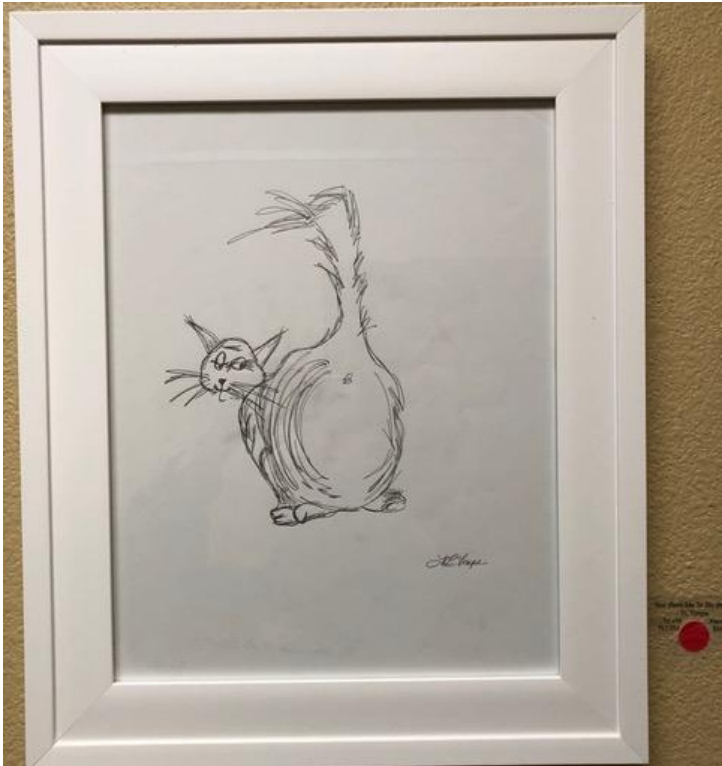
The Oatey's were checking out 'A Gathering of Friends' by Phyllis Emmert.

SOLD! A sketch by Terri Timpe called "You Want Me to do What?!!!"



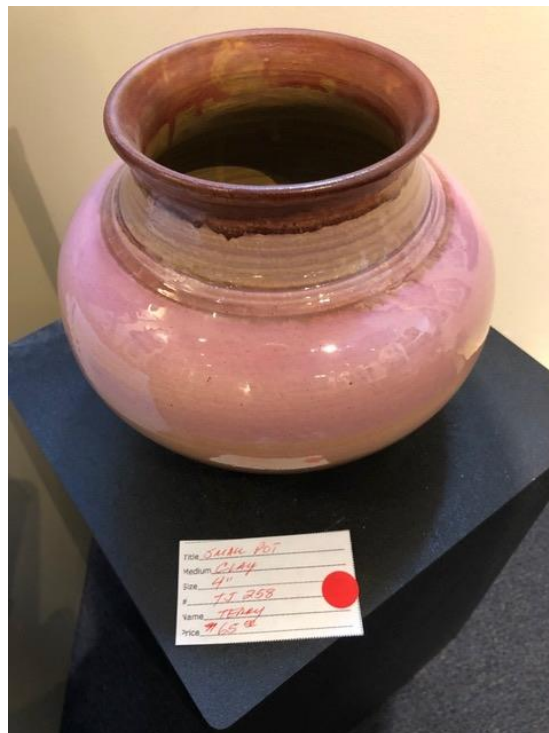
A train track by Christian Sanchez takes us down the West Wing of the gallery.

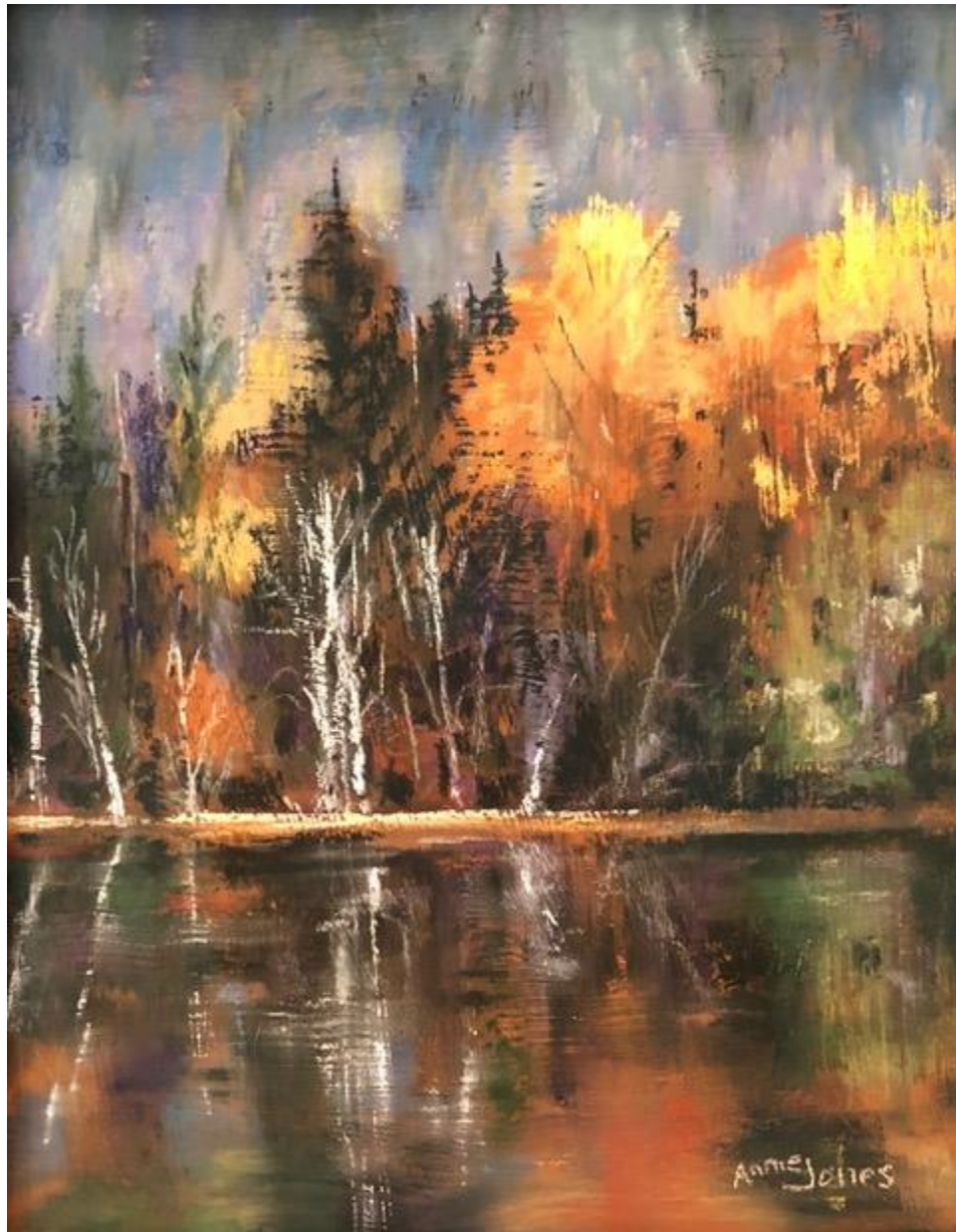
SOLD! A secret shopper purchased a pot by Terry Johnson.

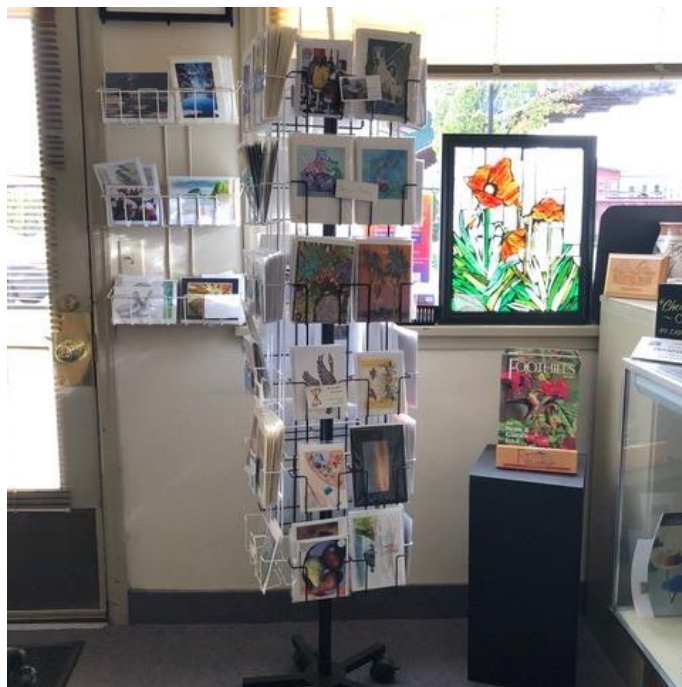
Phyllis Emmert will be teaching a class at the gallery this fall.
