It's always good to see other artists attending our shows. Jeff Justice and his wife make it a habit of attending.




Yes, and artists often buy other artist's work. Brad Brisbine bought this painting of Terri's. It is a real compliment for another artist to buy your work.

His mother would buy fruit from their porch.




Justin got to meet Terry Johnson, 'Wenatchee's Picasso'.


The painting on the wall is the latest oil by Jan Cook Mack.
