Marie Alice and husband Bruce greeted visitors as they came. Bruce is next to his chiropractor & wife who became close friends.



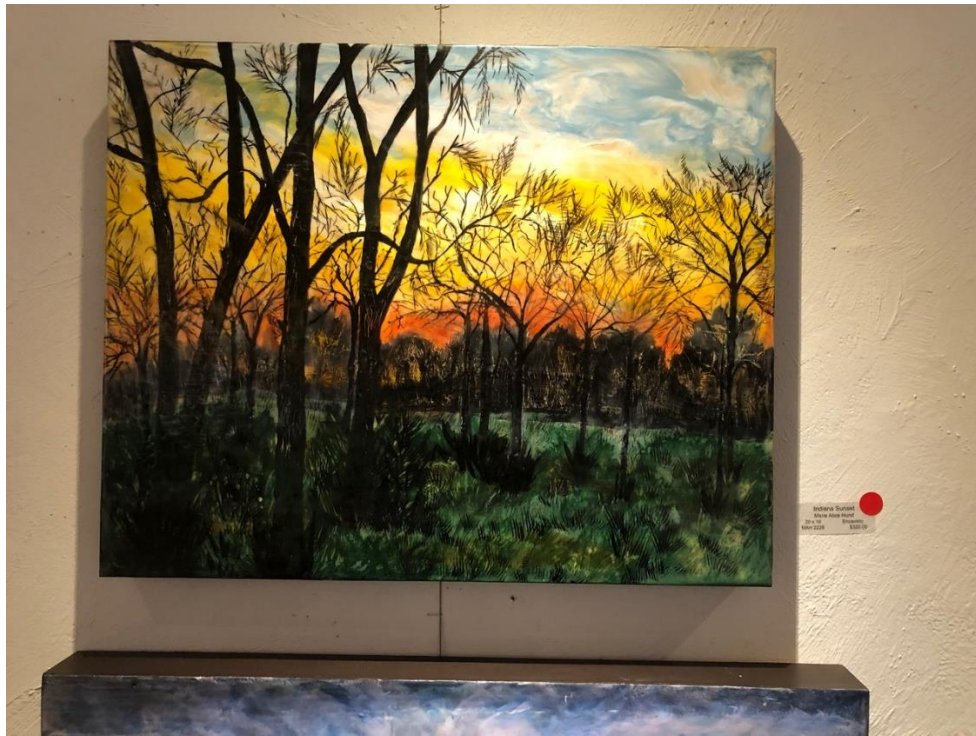
Many friends from Manson, Lake Chelan and Twisp came to support the show.



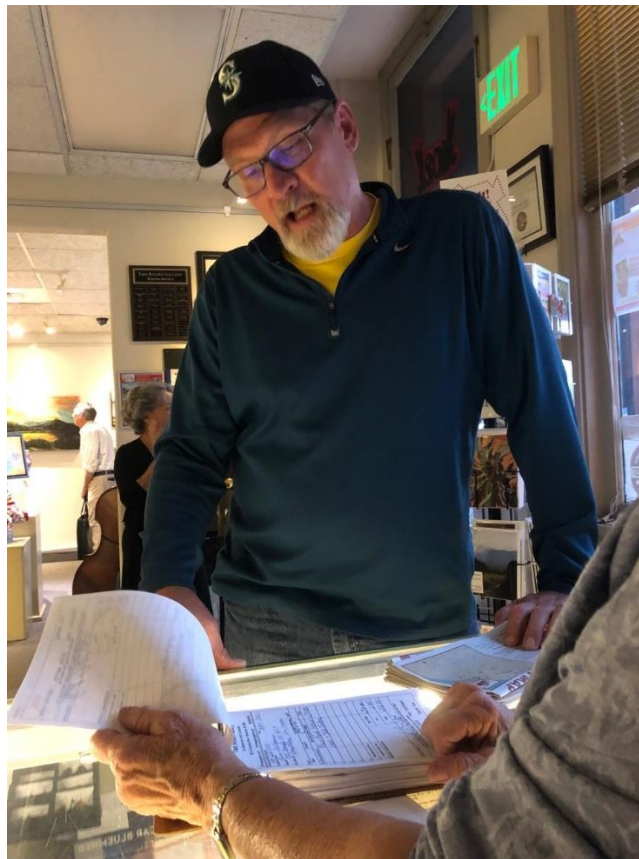
Winners of the Plein Air Paint Out are on display until they are sold. There may be little time to see them as they are outstanding works.

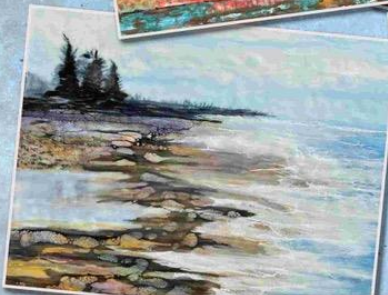
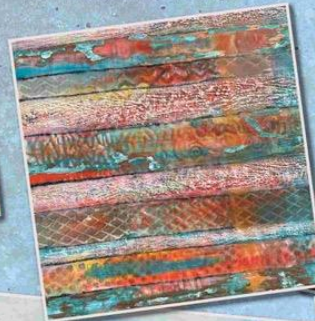
Marie Alice Hurst



Nature's incredible diversity of colors and patterns has always fascinated Marie Alice Hurst. She finds great joy in the beauty that surrounds her, and it is out of this sense of wonder and gratitude that her art emerges.

After a fulfilling career as an educator in Chelan, her creative talent led her to pursue art. She has taken classes from leading artists in different media as she continues to develop her artistic voice.

This collection showcases her journey with Encaustic painting. Encaustic, which means "burning in", is an ancient form of painting with a molten medium made with beeswax and damar tree resin. Layer upon layer is applied, fused and sculpted to produce works with depth, texture and luminosity. Encaustic is a medium like no other and it offers endless possibilities. This collection showcases her stained glass mosaics and her journey with encaustic painting.
