A. When you are not entering art for a two month show, remove your prints and cards unless you pay a showing fee.

B. Docents should review the procedures for making a sale on each work day. 1. Write a receipt & always include the date and the buyers phone number. 2. Sign your name legibly at the bottom of the receipt. Hit SALE on the card reader. Type in the total. Finally enter card into slot and push green button.

C. Always keep the gallery as you do your home. We have a duster, a vacuum, windex, and paper towels. Continue wearing a mask as people enter the gallery. We continue to require masks for our visitors.

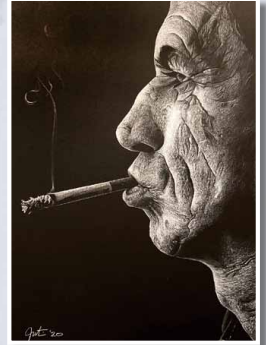


"When I finally transitioned into being a full time artist in 2020, it didn't take long to determine what my subject would be.

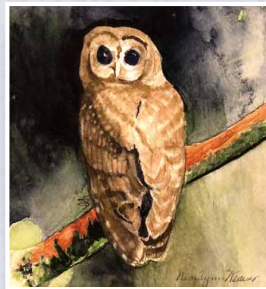
I have a passion for music, sports and portraiture so it became my quest to find images to inspire my next piece.
