

We appreciate Tony as he is saving us over \$700 by removing the carpeting. His crew will be doing the heavy lifting and repainting our pedestals.

The board has chosen the carpet from Designer Floors. The new owners of the building have agreed to provide \$6000 to help with the flooring and will offer us a 3 year lease. Our lease automatically goes up 3% annually.

Gallery Board Sets Changes for our members

• To show cards or prints members must be **up to date** on the monthly \$10 showing fee. There will be a maximum of two dozen cards any member can show. (Keep your cards fresh)

• All featured artists will pay \$25 for the opportunity to show their work for one month. We are taking requests for 2024 featured artists.

Gallery physical changes

• We are no longer selling magazines.

• Print bins will be replaced by Print holders. Artists will be able to show up to six prints at a time. They should be removed along with cards if the artist decides not to enter their work at any time. (No double copies)

• We now have only two glass cases for jewelry to accommodate 4 artists. All pottery and craft items will be limited to what you have on the Entry form. Each piece will have a gallery made label.

• We have a new donation box. New membership forms will be in packets.

Other changes and additions

• Debbie Benbow will be assisting our Social Media efforts. We all need to help promote the gallery by sending our events to your contacts and social media chats.

• Ten KOHO radio ads will be added to our First Friday advertising Tuesday through Friday Presently we have ads on Northwest Public Radio on both their News stations as well as classical. Monies from the Woods Family Music & Arts Fund will help us promote our events.

• The painters are finished and the carpet install begins Tuesday January 17. Blinds have been ordered. Resetting the gallery will begin by January 20. There is much to do and we could use more hands if you have time.

• ENTRY for work will take place once every two months with the exception of February, March, and April. Annual membership is due and \$30 to show for the three months. Please use checks or cash as it costs us each time a charge card is used.

• We are starting out the new year with First Friday February 3rd, featuring artist Sonia (Sonny) Ramsey. Poster attached. Our Grand ReOpening will be March 3 featuring works by Allan Gossett. We will be celebrating our 14th Anniversary as well.


Those Who Care, Share


If you have the spirit and the heart to see our members (like you!) grow and succeed, here are some of the immediate ways you can help:

- We are looking for 2 -3 people to work on a Social Media committee and to share in the effort of making active and engaging postings. We post for our 1st Friday events, but recognize we could have a greater presence with more activity on our Facebook and Instagram accounts. Our ultimate goal is to post something relevant and uplifting daily! We welcome your assistance and ideas on how we can improve our online presence.
