

Local artist Marti (Martha) Lyttle dreamed of being at the easel and after years as a Seattle area psychotherapist retired to discover her talent as a landscape artist. After moving to Wenatchee she became enamored by the natural arid climate and environment of the east side of the state.

Her impressionist side discovered regional landscapes such as the sage hills, meadows, rivers and rock cliffs rich with varied colors and glowing light. Her paintings brought her to paint scenes that evoke a sense of calm serenity and invite a narrative.

As time went on Marti was ready for a break from representational art to experimentation with design techniques. She moved on to abstract painting using mixed media, having been successful in oil and acrylic paints.

In 2019 she was chosen to paint the Centennial poster for the Washington State Apple Blossom festival that shows a springtime view of orchards rich in colors and glowing light.

Marti exhibits art at Two Rivers Gallery and in other venues on both the East and West sides of the mountains.
