3rd Place - Jen Evenhus (bottom), Martin Scott Winery, Impressionistic style used on this year's winning painting.



Apple Blossom Painting

The 2023 Apple Blossom Festival painting was created by our gallery member Sasha Syssoeva Fair. The initial sketches and color studies were done at an orchard in East Wenatchee in Spring 2022, then finished in Sasha's studio. The process took 4 months. It's an oil painting done in layers with several glazes at the end. Sasha picked a high quality closed corner frame for it with a custom made nameplate in gold.

The painting was sold at the Annual Festival Fundraiser on October 22nd for over \$3000, with all proceeds to the Festival. Canvas prints can be ordered on the Festival website https://


